NOTE: Competitors are responsible to include a copy of all USDF and USEF memberships for horse, owner, rider, trainer, and coach listed on entry form or pay non-member fees. Freestyle classes must include a copy of a qualifying test with entry.

Stabling fees: Stalls are permanent 12' x 12' stalls with doors (available 12PM Thursday to 7PM Sunday)

Stall fee for the weekend: \$130.00 (includes initial 3 bags of shavings)

Tack stall fee for the weekend: \$100.00

Day stall fee: \$ 75.00 (includes initial 2 bags of shavings, in by 5PM the night before, out by 6PM)

Day tack stall fee: \$ 50.00 (in by 5PM the night before, out by 6PM)

Early arrival / Late departure: \$ 45.00 per night per stall or tack stall

Trailer-In fee: \$ 50.00 per day

Bedding: Bedding can be ordered in advance by completing the TRHP Show Services Advance Order form located in this prize list or online at www.texasrosehorsepark.com under Exhibitor information. Bedding orders are made directly with and mailed to Texas Rose Horse Park(TRHP). Shavings are \$11.00/bag. No outside shavings allowed. Please make all checks payable to TRHP. TRHP will charge a \$100 fine for anyone bringing in shavings from outside the facility.

No staples or nails are allowed inside or outside of the stalls or anywhere on TRHP property. No taping or stapling of advertisements or flyers to walls or stalls. Exhibitors wishing to post information must obtain TRHP written approval before posting. Such Information is to be posted on approved bulletin boards with push pins. All non-approved postings will be removed. No smoking in the barns or adjacent areas.

Required Vaccination, Coggins, Health Certificate information: USEF Equine Vaccination Rule & Health Requirements for entry to show grounds in 2021: All horses entering the showgrounds of a USEF licensed competition *MUST* be accompanied by documentation showing vaccinations for Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) within 6 months of the show dates and must have a current negative EIA/Coggins test (within 12 months) This is mandatory for every horse entry. See USEF rule GR845. Also, a health certificate (30-day) is needed on all out of state horses.

Refunds: Refunds must be submitted in writing and will be given from opening date to the closing date of the show, less the office fee. No refunds of any kind for any reason, including Act of God, will be given after the closing date or throughout the competition. Absolutely NO refunds will be made at the show. Refunds will be mailed within thirty (30) days at the conclusion of the event by TRHP. All entries are accepted with this understanding.

Qualifying Classes - For Great American/USDF Qualifying: Please indicate that the class is to count for Great American/USDF qualifying by placing a **Q** after the class number on your entry. Qualifying does not require a separate ride. An exhibitor riding in the Open, Adult Amateur, or Junior/Young Rider classes must pay an additional \$15.00 USDF fee to have this score entered in the Great American/USDF qualifying division at that level.

Qualifying Classes - For Southwest (SWDC) Qualifying: Please indicate that the class is to count for SWDC qualifying by placing a **SW** after the class number. **For Southwest Pony Qualifying:** Please indicate that the class is to count for SWDC Pony qualifying by placing a **P** after the class number. An additional \$10.00 SW qualifying fee is required for each SW or P.

Non-Compete Horses: Non-compete horses are allowed on grounds. Must fill out entry form and pay office, non-compete, and stabling fees, but no USEF drug fee. Must also include copy of current coggins and flu/rhino vaccinations.


Confirmation/Times: Confirmation of entry will be e-mailed. All e-mail addresses must be clearly printed. Ride times and show updates will be posted on www.DressageShowInfo.com. Entries taken on a first come, first served basis. Entries may close early if time limits for judges are filled. Remaining entries received before the closing date will be placed on a wait list.

No Shows and Scratches: All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office prior to their first ride will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled.

Awards: Divisions (JR/YR, AA, and Open) may be run concurrently as one class. Divisions will be pinned separately. Riders must clearly specify division choice. When no designation is made, riders will automatically be entered as Open. Riders may enter only one division per class. Prizes for first place and ribbons to sixth place. No awards for qualifying class. Championship and Reserves awarded for the highest percentage at each USEF level at each division and for all FEI levels combined for the Texas Dressage Classic I show. Freestyles will be excluded from all Championship and Reserve awards. Also, overall high point awards for Open, AA, and Junior/Young Rider divisions for the Texas Dressage Classic I show will be awarded.

Pony Measurements: If you do not have a measurement card for your pony, you must notify the show secretary in advance of the show start of any pony needing a measurement. Show management will notify both the veterinarian and Technical Delegate of any competitors requiring pony measurements All ponies competing in pony classes that do not have a valid pony measurement card must be measured prior to the first class shown. In addition, please indicate your measurement request on your entry form and include the \$100/pony measurement fee on your entry. Measurement requests MUST be received prior to the start of competition. **Ponies will be measured at 6:30 am on Friday, April 9th.**

Directions - From the East (Shreveport Area): Take I-20 west to the Van/Tyler exit, Highway 110 exit (#548). Turn left/south. Go approximately 1 mile. The equestrian center is on the left.

Directions - From the West (Dallas Area): Take I-20 east to the Van/Tyler exit, Highway 110 exit (#548). Turn right/south. Go approximately 1. The equestrian center is on the left.

Directions - From the South (Houston area): Take US 287 north to TX-155 towards Tyler. At FM- 2661 turn left. Left again at TX -64, right onto CR- 413, then left at FM -724. Follow FM-724 to CR-42 and turn right. At TX-110 turn left. The equestrian center is on the right.

Directions - From the South (San Antonio area): Take I-35 north to US-84 and turn right. Follow US-84 to TX-31, turn right. At FM-314 turn left, right on to FM-279, left on to FM-314 then right onto CR-4906. At CR-4907 turn left to a right turn at CR-4908. This road turns into CR-426. At CR-422 turn right, then right on to FM-1955, and left on to TX-110. The equestrian center is on the right.

Footing: Main performance arenas are large standard outdoor arenas with all-weather limestone base and sand footing. Show may elect to run some classes in a small arena if entries warrant. Adjacent schooling and lunging areas of same footing. Indoor arena with sand/clay mix footing.

Dogs: Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from their dog's behaviors. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7, as well as issuance of warning cards pursuant to rule USEF rule GR 301. In addition, pursuant to facility regulations, loose dogs will be removed by animal control from the show grounds at the owner's expense.

Golf Cars/Mopeds/Etc: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Additionally, pursuant to Texas Rose Horse Park facility rules, no ATV's or motorcycles of engine size 50cc or greater are allowed on the facility property. All vehicles must observe posted speed limits at all times.

Warning: Under the Equine Activity Liability Act, each participant who participates in an equine activity expressly assumes the risks of engaging in and legal responsibility for injury, loss, or damage to person or property resulting from the risk of equine activities.

Weather/Acts of God/Accidents or Emergency Policy: Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, acts of God, accidents, or emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to USEF Program classes. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, acts of God, accidents, or emergencies. Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult
 amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

Note for Opportunity Classes: Opportunity classes are intended for entry level riders. Horses and riders entered only in "Opportunity" classes are exempt from USEF and USDF membership requirements, and do not have to pay non-member (show pass) or HID fees. Federation and drug fees do not apply. Horses entered only in these classes are still subject to and must comply with the Drugs and Medication rules and are subject to drug testing. Riders and/or horses entered in opportunity classes may not cross enter into other recognized classes at the show. Participants must abide by all USEF regulations pertaining to attire, tack, and equipment for the recognized show. Reference USEF rule GR821 for additional information.

Note for Eventing Tests: Beginner Novice Test A through Preliminary Test A will be shown in the short arena. Preliminary Test B through Advanced Test B will be shown in the long arena. See USEF rule DR 119 for level equivalencies. All Eventing Tests are 2018 edition.

Note for Qualifying Fees: Enter a "Q" after the class number if you intend on entering the class as a Great American/USDF Qualifier and include the qualifying fee of \$15. If you also intend on entering the class as a qualifier for SWDC enter a "SW" (or "P" for SWDC Pony qualifying) after the class number and include the qualifying fee of \$10.

Note: Classes may not necessarily run in the order listed here.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

- 1. All RV guests must sign in at Texas Rose Horse Park Show Services Office. Check in time is 12:00 PM; Check out time is 10:00 PM on the last day of your visit. Unless a later time is cleared through the office.
- 2. RV's must be parked head in, to the left of the pedestal, as close to the pedestal as possible. Please use the hookups on the left, drivers side, of your RV.
- 3. When connecting to the water outlet, please leave back flow valves in place and insure there are no leaks.
- 4. DO NOT PARK IN STREETS OR FIRE LANES. DO NOT PARK BEFORE CHECKING IN AT THE SHOW SERVICES OFFICE.
- 5. Please observe the 5 MPH speed limit at all times. No ATV's, motorcycles etc. over 50 CC's are allowed on Park grounds. Anyone operating a Motorized Vehicle on TRHP Property MUST HAVE a Valid Driver's License.
- 6. Quiet time is 10:00 PM to 7:00 AM. Please remember that your neighbor may be trying to sleep. Rowdiness, loud music, abusive language, drunkenness, and possession or use of drugs is strictly prohibited.

Golf Cart Policies & Information Hours: 8:00am—6:00pm

- 1. All cart operators MUST have valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the sate in which they reside and proof of insurance.
- 2. This is an electric golf cart, which requires periodic charging. The charger is on the golf cart—do not remove from the premises. Charger should be kept dry. Be sure the cart has a good charge before leaving for an extended ride. ALWAYS unplug the charger before moving the golf cart. ALWAYS recharge when not in use, you cannot overcharge the golf cart batteries. When you sense that the cart is losing power (i.e. sluggish, slowing down), it needs charging. An overnight charge should last a couple of days of normal use. Make sure you have plugged both ends into the proper outlets and that the meter is registering that it is taking the charge. If the meter is not registering make sure the cords are plugged in correctly and fully.
- 3. Your cart has a toggle switch with F-orward, R-everse, center is Neutral, please keep switch in center position when not in use. When in the reverse, you should hear a backing horn (buzzing sound).
- 4. Maximum of five (5) persons, regardless of age, on golf cart at any one time.
- 5. Carts are NOT to leave TRHP property for any reason.
- 6. Please park the golf carts in a safe place at night do not leave out uncovered.
- 7. Golf Carts cannot be parked in fire lane.
- 8. Please take the key out when not in use. There will be a \$20.00 charge for missing key that is not returned to Rental Agent.
- 9. Remember you are responsible for any damages incurred to the cart or other property while renting the cart.
- 10. Please report any problems you have with your cart to TRHP Show Services Office immediately at 903-881-0348.
- 11. Your cart should be returned by 6:00pm on the last day of your rental. Please remove all trash and personal items before returning cart. - PARKING: Parking in designated areas only. NO PARKING is allowed in the barn area. TEMPORARY PARKING in barn areas is
 for the unloading and loading of trailers only. All trailers should be dropped in the approved lot and are not allowed to park
 in the stabling area. Public Parking is in designated areas only.
- 2. CAMPER'S/RV'S/HORSE TRAILERS WITH LIVING SPACE: Must go to campground for hook-up. NO HOOK-UP ALLOWED TO THE BARNS AT ANY TIME! Limited spots available please reserve you space through the TRHP Show Services Office. RV spaces are assigned through TRHP Show Services Office.
- 3. GOLF CARTS/ATV'S: a privilege-not a right-extended to show participants. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicle, as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the Rental Agreement of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Golf carts can be rented through TRHP show services in the show office. Golf carts are rented on a first come first served bases and TRHP strongly suggests that reservations be made in advanced. NO FOUR-WHEELERS, THREE WHEELERS, OR MOTOR BIKES OVER 50 cc ARE ALLOWED ON PARK GROUNDS. Golf Carts, mopeds, rural rate vehicles such as Gators and Mules, scooters, small motor bikes, and bicycles are allowed.
- 4. DOGS: Must be on a leash (not to exceed 6 feet in length) or suitably restrained in a tack stall/cage etc. Loose animal/s left in vehicles in distress, etc. can and will be removed from the grounds at the owner's expense.
- 5. HORSES: Have the right-of-way at all times.
- **6. EXHIBITOR PROBLEMS/SPECIAL REQUESTS:** All non-emergency problems or special requests must be relayed through show management to ensure prompt attention.
- 7. FIRE CODES: TRHP does not allow any of the following in stalls, barns or tents:
 - · No 2-prong plug appliances. No 2-prong plug extension cords. No light duty cords for indoor use.
 - No 3-way adaptors unless specifically made for outdoors.
 - No cooking in barns or tents.
 - No smoking in barns or tents.
 - No overloading electrical outlets.
 - No electrical cords on the ground or buried. FANS IN THE STABLE AREA THAT ARE CONNECTED TO A 3-PRONG HEAVY DUTY OUTDOOR EXTENSION CORD OR 3-PRONG OUTDOOR ADAPTER ARE ACCEPTABLE.
- 8. STALLS: TRHP does not permit the use of any nails, fencing staples, screws, duct tape, or any other things to be driven into any portion of the stalls or buildings, nor the signs to be affixed, with any type of material(s) that may cause damage, changes, alterations, repairs, painting or staining of any part of the stalls or buildings. Any erection or installation of equipment must be made with material(s) that are temporary in nature and will not cause permanent damage such as zip-ties, Velcro, light duty staples, masking tape, etc. NO outside shavings permitted. Violators will be charged \$100 per stall.
- 9. WASTE DISPOSAL: All trash should be placed in proper containers that are located throughout the park. Muck generated during event must be placed in designated areas. Muck should not be placed in the barns, at the end of the barns, or in any other non-designated area.
- 10. SCHOOLING/LONGEING: Schooling is at designated times/places only and will be set and posted by show management. Longeing is not allowed in any arena. Lunge in designated areas only.

Additional Entry Information:

Amateur (AA) Classes:

- Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as Adult Amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22.
- Only active United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) members may obtain amateur status. (Exception: Equine Canada members in possession of current EC membership may sign for USEF Amateur status on a show by show basis at no cost).
- Participants must possess current USEF Amateur status and qualify under the USEF Amateur rules
- If opportunity classes at Dressage Competitions are restricted to amateurs, riders are required to have an amateur status with USEF.

Junior/Young Rider Classes (JR/YR):

Riders are eligible to compete in these classes until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21

Pony division:

For this competition, classes are offered from USEF Training Level through USEF Third level with classes designated for JR/YR, Adult Amateur, and Open riders.

- The pony division is open to all breeds that meets the following measurement requirements. In the Dressage Division, a pony is an animal that does not exceed 148 cm (14.23 hh) without shoes, and 149 cm (14.27 hh) with shoes. The pony can be of any sex (mare, stallion, or gelding).
- Ponies under the age of eight and in possession of a valid temporary card from another division or discipline should submit a copy with their entry.
- Measurement will be required for these pony specific classes if they do not currently have a valid measurement card.
- Measurement will be yearly beginning from the age of three (36 months) until the pony has reached the age of eight years. Animals
 three through seven years old will be issued an annual Temporary Certificate of Measurement and must be re-measured annually
 until the age of eight years. Animals eight years and older will be issued Standard Certificates of Measurement which will not need
 to be renewed. Measurement must be done on USEF Combined Driving and Dressage Pony Measurement form.
- Individual responsible for presenting the pony for measurement must be 18 years old.
- Animals submitted for measurement or re-measurement must show no evidence of lameness, and must be jogged for soundness prior to the measurement. Animals showing evidence of lameness are not eligible for measurement or re measurement.
- The pony must be entered to compete at the competition for a measurement to take place.
- When the competition veterinarian is on call and an alternative measurement time is necessary, management must receive a written request for measurement from the owner or agent at least five days prior to the start of competition to set up a time.

Classes per Day:

Horses are limited to a maximum of three Dressage rides per day at Fourth Level and below (including Rider Tests) or two Dressage rides per day above Fourth Level. Horses competing at both Fourth Level and Prix St. Georges, or their equivalents, are limited to two Dressage rides per day. Dressage Seat Equitation, Quadrille, Pas de Deux, and Materiale classes are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition.

Consecutive Levels:

Horses may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition.

Opportunity Classes:

Opportunity classes are intended for entry level riders. Horses and riders entered only in "Opportunity" classes are exempt from USEF and USDF membership requirements, and do not have to pay non-member (show pass) or HID fees. Federation and drug fees do not apply. Horses entered only in these classes are still subject to and must comply with the Drugs and Medication rules and are subject to drug testing. Riders and/or horses entered in "opportunity" classes may not cross enter into other recognized classes at the show. Participants must abide by all USEF regulations pertaining to attire, tack and equipment for the recognized show. Reference USEF rule GR821 for additional information.

General Regulations, Policies, and Entry Specifications:

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules are in force from the moment show management allows access to the showgrounds. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire.

Liability – Horses by their inherent nature present a risk. This show, the management, the USEF Licensee, and the facility will not be responsible for any loss or damage or injury to horses exhibited, or for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost or destroyed, or in any way injured. Each exhibitor will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person, whomsoever, by any horse owned or exhibited by said exhibitor and shall indemnify the show, the management, the show committee and volunteers, the USEF Licensee, the USEF and USDF, or any member thereof, against all claims and demands, of any nature or kind, that may grow out of any injury occasioned by any horses owned or exhibited by them, or arise from the negligence of the person in charge of any such horse. All horses exhibited in this show participate entirely at the owner's risk. Neither the Organizing Committee, show volunteers and staff, the facility or its owners, USEF or USDF or their members will be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors or spectators. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

Additionally:

- Texas Rose Horse Park (TRHP), and their officials, sponsors and employees will not be responsible for any accident or loss which
 may occur to any exhibitor, spectators, guest, rider, groom, attendant or other employee, animal, or equipment at any of the
 competition.
- WARNING: Under Texas law (Chapter 87, Civil Practice and Remedies Code), a farm animal profession is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in farm animal activities resulting from the inherent risks of farm animal activities.

USEF Membership Statement (GR901.9)

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Exhibitors should exercise extreme caution before medicating their horses and should be aware of the US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules governing drugs and medications. Any questions about the use of certain medications and regarding Rule IV should be directed to the USEF Federation Equine Drugs and Medications Program, 956 King Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43212-2655. (800) 633-2472, (614) 299-7707, FAX (614) 299-7706.

A trainer is defined as any adult who has responsibility for the horse on the competition grounds and must sign the entry form.

Protective Headgear Rule: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses and those competing in all classes and tests must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must be immediately prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.

Musical Freestyles: Music must be on good quality CD and must be presented to the announcer at least two hours before scheduled ride. The schedule for sound checks will be posted at the show.

Bridle Numbers: Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is being exercised or ridden.

Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials and refuse any entry for a cause; to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his or her horse for cause; to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his or her ribbons and winnings for cause; to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause; all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition.

Important notice to all affected parties: Third parties may come upon the property or enter the facilities where any herein described or listed event will occur; provided, that this is a license to enter the premises, for the purpose of observing or participating in the event, but not otherwise, and such license to any individual is subject to revocation by the owner, lessee or organizer, and entry for any purpose other than granted herein, shall be deemed criminal trespass and subject to appropriate legal proceedings.

Attention Competitors: Each competitor is responsible for supplying the show management with the correct and required association numbers of USDF and/or USEF for the horse, owner, rider, coaches, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not count towards national awards. All entries for Open Classes are taken on a first come, first served basis. Only one horse-rider combination per entry form.

No Shows: All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled. Exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement.

Sharps Disposal: Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Containers are located at the end of each barn aisle and within center aisles when center aisles are present within the barns.

Dogs: Facility rules require that dogs must be on a leash (not to exceed 6 feet in length) or suitably restrained in a tack stall/cage etc. Loose animals/animals left in vehicles in distress, etc. can and will be removed from the grounds at the owner's expense.

Membership/Registration Requirements for GAIG/USDF Qualifying Classes: Riders must be current USDF Participating members and USEF members (Junior, Senior, or Life) in good standing. Horses must be USDF Lifetime Registered and USEF Annual or Lifetime recorded. Horses with only an HID recording are not eligible. Owners must be current USDF Participating or Business members and USEF members (Junior, Senior, or Life) in good standing. For current Great American/USDF Championship requirements, see: www.usdf.org/competitions/competitionschampionships/regionals/index.asp.

Show Schedule and Ride Time Conflicts: It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule. Changes need to be requested in the show office by 3pm the day prior.

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

Safe Sport: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

Current Rules: The rules may have changed from the current USEF Rule Book. It is the competitor's responsibility to check the current USEF Rule Book for any changes. Current rules can be found on www.usef.org

<u>USDF Membership Benefits:</u> USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

This competition is recognized by USDF for 2021

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions:

Owners and riders, including foreign riders

and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. **Business Membership (BM):** A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.



2021 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2021 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s). A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life, or Recorded Farm (with Active Farm Owner)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- * PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

ODEN

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.

Important considerations for qualifying:

- A horse/rider combination may qualify for the SWDC Championship by earning two qualifying scores in qualifying classes at SWDC recognized shows during the SWDC qualifying year. Qualifying classes are the highest test at each level, with the exception of Walk/Trot which will use the USDF Intro Test B. Winning or placing in the class is not necessary as long as the score is earned. These scores must be earned at two different competitions from two different judges.
- 2. An \$10.00 fee is added to the regular entry fee when entering a qualifying class at an SWDC recognized competition. \$1.00 of the fee is to provide for the volunteer's services at the Championships, \$5.00 of this fee is allocated for prize money at the Championships, and the remaining \$4.00 will be used to help pay for awards (any of the \$4.00 not used for prizes will be added to the prize money).
- 3. One score may be earned at a show that is not approved by the SWDC as long as the show is outside of Region 9 and recognized by USEF/USDF AND the rider submits the score (a copy of the front of a signed dressage test) and a fee of \$25.00 to the SWDC Qualifying Secretary within two weeks of the end of the competition. If the score is not received within the two weeks, it will not apply.
- 4. A horse/rider combination having won the Championships at a certain level and division may not compete at that level and division or below in the Championships in subsequent years (except Grand Prix). However, the horse may compete at any level with a different rider.
- 5. Riders in the Walk/Trot level must not have competed in a recognized show above First Level.
- 6. Each rider must declare the division in which they are competing prior to each attempt at a qualifying ride at SWDC qualifying shows or for a score submitted under Rule 4 (AA, JR/YR, or OPEN) and must provide proof of eligibility in the case of AA and JR/YR. The intent to qualify for a particular division must be designated on the entry form. Adult Amateur, Junior/Young Riders, and Ponies may also qualify for the Open division. Separate qualifying scores must be earned for each division. At the SWDC Championships they must enter each division separately and will ride in each division separately. If a competitor is found to have entered a division in which they are NOT ELIGIBLE they must default to show in the Open division if their qualifying scores are sufficient to qualify in that division.
- 7. In qualifying classes with more than one judge, scores of the judges of the ride will be averaged. For purposes of obtaining qualifying scores from two judges, so long as one judge in the judging combination is changed, it will constitute a different judge.
- 8. Qualifying rides must be ridden in an unmodified standard 20m x 60m arena, with the exception of Walk/Trot which may be ridden in a 20m x 40m arena.
- 9. Competitors wishing to qualify for the Training or First Level Open Pony Championships may ride a qualifying test at Training or First Level in any division. These qualifying scores do not have to be earned in classes restricted to ponies, but the competitor must declare prior to the start of the ride their intent to qualify for the SWDC Pony Championship class. Failure to do so will result in the default to the Open division. Ponies must meet height requirements set by the USEF (rule DR135) in order to be eligible for this division at the Championships.
- 10. Junior Riders may qualify for the SWDC Open Third Level Freestyle Championship Class using qualifying scores obtained from Junior Rider Freestyle and Young Riders may qualify for the SWDC Open FEI Level Freestyle class using the Young Riders Freestyle. Scores must meet the division percentages and the rider must state the intention to qualify for those classes and pay qualifying fees PRIOR TO THE RIDE.
- 11. Competitors may check scores by checking the http://www.swdressage.org website or by emailing the SWDC Qualifying Secretary at qualifying@swdressage.org To permit recording, scores will not be available until at least three weeks after the competition.


