

Entry fees:

Office fee per entry: \$50.00 per horse/rider combination per entry per show.

Emailed entries: \$10.00 per entry per show.

Late entries: \$50.00 per show if received after the Received by/Closing date of September 8, 2025.

Incomplete entry fee: \$20.00 per entry.

Post entries at show: Will be taken as scheduling permits, class fee plus \$10.00. **Rider or Horse change:** \$25.00 for either rider or horse change after entry submitted.

Non-competing horses: \$100.00 for the weekend. Complete one entry for weekend and pay office and stall fees.

Great American/USDF Qualifying: \$20.00 per qualifying class. \$13.00 per qualifying class. \$100/pony measured. \$23.00 per show.

USDF Non-member fee: \$55.00 USDF non-member fee for rider and owner – per show.

USDF Affidavit fee: \$ 5.00 per form – per show.

Credit card convenience fee: A credit card convenience fee of 4% will be charged on all credit card transactions.

Note: Competitors are responsible to include a copy of all USDF and USEF memberships for horse, owner, rider, trainer, and coach listed on entry form or pay non-member fees. Freestyle classes must include a copy of a qualifying test with entry.

Stabling fees: Stalls are permanent 12' x 12' stalls with doors (available 12PM Thursday to 7PM Sunday)

Stall fee for entire weekend: \$150.00 (includes initial 3 bags of shavings)

Tack stall fee for entire weekend: \$125.00

Day stall fee: \$100.00 (includes initial 2 bags of shavings, in by 5PM the night before, out by 6PM)

Day tack stall fee: \$ 75.00 (in by 5PM the night before, out by 6PM)

Early arrival / Late departure: \$ 45.00 per night per stall or tack stall

Trailer-In fee: \$ 65.00 per day

Bedding: Bedding can be ordered in advance by completing the TRHP Show Services Advance Order form located in this prize list or online at www.texasrosehorsepark.com under Exhibitor information. Bedding orders are made directly with and mailed to Texas Rose Horse Park(TRHP). Shavings are \$12.00/bag. No outside shavings allowed. Please make all checks payable to TRHP. TRHP will charge a \$100 fine for anyone bringing in shavings from outside the facility.

No staples or nails are allowed inside or outside of the stalls or anywhere on TRHP property. No taping or stapling of advertisements or flyers to walls or stalls. Exhibitors wishing to post information must obtain TRHP written approval before posting. Such information is to be posted on approved bulletin boards with push pins. All non-approved postings will be removed. No smoking in the barns or adjacent areas.

Required Vaccination, Coggins, Health Certificate information: USEF Equine Vaccination Rule & Health Requirements for entry to show grounds in 2025: All horses entering the showgrounds of a USEF licensed competition *MUST* be accompanied by documentation showing vaccinations for Equine Influenza Virus (Flu) and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) within 6 months of the show dates. This is mandatory for every horse entry. See USEF rule GR844. Must also have a current negative EIA/Coggins test within 12 months of the show dates. A health certificate (30-day) is required for all out of state horses.

Refunds: Refunds must be submitted in writing and will be given from opening date to the closing date of the show, less the office fee. No refunds of any kind for any reason, including Act of God, will be given after the closing date or throughout the competition. Absolutely NO refunds will be made at the show. Refunds will be mailed within thirty (30) days at the conclusion of the event by TRHP. All entries are accepted with this understanding.

Great American/USDF Qualifying: Please indicate that the class is to count for Great American/USDF qualifying by placing a **Q** after the class number on your entry. Qualifying does not require a separate ride. An exhibitor riding in the Open, Adult Amateur, or Junior/Young Rider classes must pay an additional \$20.00 USDF fee to have this score entered in the Great American/USDF qualifying division at that level.

Southwest (SWDC) Qualifying: Please indicate that the class is to count for SWDC qualifying by placing a **SW** after the class number. **For Southwest Pony Qualifying:** Please indicate that the class is to count for SWDC Pony qualifying by placing a **P** after the class number. An additional \$13.00 SW qualifying fee is required for each SW or P.

Non-Compete Horses: Non-compete horses are allowed on grounds. Must fill out entry form and pay office, non-compete, and stabling fees, but no USEF drug fee. Must also include copy of current coggins and flu/rhino vaccination.

Confirmation/Times: Confirmation of entry will be e-mailed. All e-mail addresses must be clearly printed. Ride times and show updates will be posted on www.foxvillage.com. Entries taken on a first come, first served basis. Entries may close early if time limits for judges are filled. Remaining entries received before the closing date will be placed on a wait list.

Musical Freestyles: Music must be on two clearly marked CDs with only one track on it and must be given to the show secretary in the show office upon arrival, or music can be emailed in MP3 format to the announcer Erin Woods at erinwoods318@gmail.com. Make sure to include rider name, horse name, and test level in your email. Sound checks will be conducted at time posted in show office. Competitors are responsible for picking up their music before the end of the show. Music left at the show will not be mailed.

No Shows and Scratches: All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office prior to their first ride will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled.

Awards: Divisions (JR/YR, AA, and Open) may be run concurrently as one class. Divisions will be pinned separately. Riders must clearly specify division choice. When no designation is made, riders will automatically be entered as Open. Riders may enter only one division per class. Prizes for first place and ribbons to sixth place. No awards for qualifying class. Ribbons can be picked up in the show office at the conclusion of each class.

Championship and Reserves awarded for the highest percentage at each USEF level at each division and for all FEI levels combined for the Texas Dressage Classic I show. Freestyles are excluded from all Championship and Reserve awards. Overall high point awards for Open, AA, and Junior/Young Rider divisions for the Texas Dressage Classic I show also awarded.

Pony Measurements: If you do not have a measurement card for your pony, you must notify the show secretary in advance of the show start of any pony needing a measurement. Show management will notify both the veterinarian and Technical Delegate of any competitors requiring pony measurements All ponies competing in pony classes that do not have a valid pony measurement card must be measured prior to the first class shown. In addition, please indicate your measurement request on your entry form and include the \$100/pony measurement fee on your entry. Measurement requests MUST be received prior to the start of competition. **Ponies will be measured at 6:30 am on Friday, September 20th.**

- From the South (Houston area): Take US 287 north to TX-155 towards Tyler. At FM- 2661 turn left. Left again at TX -64, right onto CR- 413, then left at FM -724. Follow FM-724 to CR-42 and turn right. At TX-110 turn left. The equestrian center is on the right.

At CR-4907 turn left to a right turn at CR-4908. This road turns into CR-426. At CR-422 turn right, then right on to FM-1955, left on to TX-110. The equestrian center is on the right.



Dogs: Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from their dog's behaviors. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7, as well as issuance of warning cards pursuant to rule **USEF Rule GR 301**. In addition, pursuant to facility regulations, loose dogs will be removed by animal control from the show grounds at the owner's expense.

Golf Cars/Mopeds/Etc: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Additionally, pursuant to Texas Rose Horse Park facility rules, no ATV's or motorcycles of engine size 50cc or greater are allowed on the facility property. All vehicles must observe posted speed limits at all times.

An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition. Ribbons awarded through 8th Place and gift certificates awarded to top four riders.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.

b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult
 amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

Riders and/or horses entered in opportunity classes may not cross enter into other recognized classes at the show. Golf Cart Policies & Information Hours: 8:00am—6:00pm

- 1. All cart operators MUST have valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the sate in which they reside and proof of insurance.
- 2. This is an electric golf cart, which requires periodic charging. The charger is on the golf cart—do not remove from the premises. Charger should be kept dry. Be sure the cart has a good charge before leaving for an extended ride. ALWAYS unplug the charger before moving the golf cart. ALWAYS recharge when not in use, you cannot overcharge the golf cart batteries. When you sense that the cart is losing power (i.e. sluggish, slowing down), it needs charging. An overnight charge should last a couple of days of normal use. Make sure you have plugged both ends into the proper outlets and that the meter is registering that it is taking the charge. If the meter is not registering make sure the cords are plugged in correctly and fully.
- 3. Your cart has a toggle switch with F-orward, R-everse, center is Neutral, please keep switch in center position when not in use. When in the reverse, you should hear a backing horn (buzzing sound).
- 4. Maximum of five (5) persons, regardless of age, on golf cart at any one time.
- 5. Carts are NOT to leave TRHP property for any reason.
- 6. Please park the golf carts in a safe place at night do not leave out uncovered.
- 7. Golf Carts cannot be parked in fire lane.
- 8. Please take the key out when not in use. There will be a \$20.00 charge for missing key that is not returned to Rental Agent.
- 9. Remember you are responsible for any damages incurred to the cart or other property while renting the cart.
- 10. Please report any problems you have with your cart to TRHP Show Services Office immediately at 903-881-0348.

2026 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2026 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s). A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.
- Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF GR1102.3, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules GR1105 and GR1108 prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF.
 For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- * PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. The minimum percentages are as follows:

Important considerations for qualifying:

- A horse/rider combination may qualify for the SWDC Championship by earning two qualifying scores in qualifying classes at SWDC recognized shows during the SWDC qualifying year. Qualifying classes are the highest test at each level, with the exception of Walk Trot, which will use Intro Test B. Winning or placing in the class is not necessary as long as the score is earned. These scores must be earned at two different competitions from two different judges.
- 2. A \$13.00 fee is added to the regular entry fee when entering a Qualifying Class at an SWDC recognized competition. Approximately \$1.00 of the fee is to provide for the volunteers' services at the Championships, \$6.00 of this fee is allocated for prize money at the Championships, and the remaining \$6.00 will be used to help pay for awards and prize money.
- 3. One score may be earned at a show that is not approved by the SWDC if:
 - a. The show is outside of Region 9 and recognized by USEF/USDF and
 - b. The rider submits the score (a copy of the front of a signed dressage test) and a fee of \$25.00 to the SWDC Qualifying Secretary within two weeks of the end of the competition. If the score is not received within the two weeks, it will not apply.
- 4. Lifeline rule: to exercise this Lifeline rule a horse rider combination must have already achieved one SWDC minimum qualifying score at a level and division where the SWDC fee was paid before the ride at an SWDC approved competition. If the horse rider combination failed to pay the qualifying fee at another competition this lifeline may be exercised. The rider may pay a fee of \$75 to SWDC and send the fee, along with the score sheet or USDF record of score to the SWDC qualifying secretary to count as a second qualifying score. The second score must have been earned at an in-region SWDC approved competition. It must satisfy the minimum score for the level/division.
- 5. A horse/rider combination having won the Championships at a certain level and division may not compete at that level and division or below in the Championships in subsequent years (except Grand Prix). However, the horse may compete at any level with a different rider.
- 6. Riders in the Walk/Trot level must not have competed in a recognized show above First Level.

2026 Southwest Dressage (SWDC) Championships continued...

- 7. Each rider must declare the division in which they are competing prior to each attempt at a qualifying ride at SWDC qualifying shows or for a score submitted under Rule 3 (Amateur, Open, or Junior/Young Rider) and must provide proof of eligibility in the case of Amateur and Junior/Young Rider. The intent to qualify for a particular division must be designated on the entry form. Adult Amateur, Junior/Young Riders and Ponies may also qualify for the Open division. Separate qualifying scores must be earned for each division. At the SWDC Championships they must enter each division separately and will ride in each division separately. If a competitor is found to have entered a division in which they are NOT ELIGIBLE they must default to show in the Open division if their qualifying scores are sufficient to qualify in that division.
- 8. In qualifying classes with more than one judge, scores among the judges of the ride will be averaged. For purposes of obtaining qualifying scores from two judges, so long as one judge in the judging combination is changed, it will constitute a different judge.
- 9. Qualifying rides must be ridden in an unmodified standard 20m x 60m arena, with the exception of walk trot, which may be ridden in a 20m x 40m arena.
- 10. Competitors wishing to qualify for the Training or First Level Open Pony Championships may ride a qualifying test at Training or First Level in any division. These qualifying scores do not have to be earned in classes restricted to ponies but the competitor must declare prior to the start of the ride their intent to qualify for the SWDC Pony Championship class. Failure to do so will result in the default to the open division. Ponies must meet height requirements set by the USEF (DR135) to be eligible for this division at the Championships.
- 11. Junior Riders may qualify for the SWDC Open Third Level Freestyle Championship Class using qualifying scores obtained from Junior Rider Freestyle and Young Riders may qualify for the SWDC Open FEI Level Freestyle class using the Young Riders Freestyle. Scores must meet the division percentages and the rider must state the intention to qualify for those classes and pay qualifying fees PRIOR TO THE RIDE.
- 12. Competitors may check scores by checking the <u>www.swdressage.org</u> web site or by emailing the SWDC Qualifying Secretary at qualifying@swdressage.org. To permit recording, scores will not be available until at least three weeks after the competition.









Additional Entry Information

Amateur (AA) Classes

- Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as Adult Amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22.
- Only active United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) members may obtain amateur status. (Exception: Equine Canada members in possession of current EC membership may sign for USEF Amateur status on a show by show basis at no cost).
- Participants must possess current USEF Amateur status and qualify under the USEF Amateur rules
- If opportunity classes at Dressage Competitions are restricted to amateurs, riders are required to have an amateur status with USEF.

Junior/Young Rider Classes (JR/YR)

Riders are eligible to compete in these classes until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21

Pony Division

For this competition, classes are offered from USEF Training Level through USEF Third level with classes designated for JR/YR, Adult Amateur, and Open riders.

- The pony division is open to all breeds that meets the following measurement requirements. In the Dressage Division, a pony is an animal that does not exceed 148 cm (14.23 hh) without shoes, and 149 cm (14.27 hh) with shoes. The pony can be of any sex (mare, stallion, or gelding).
- Ponies under the age of eight and in possession of a valid temporary card from another division or discipline should submit a copy with their entry.
- Measurement will be required for these pony specific classes if they do not currently have a valid measurement card.
- Measurement will be yearly beginning from the age of three (36 months) until the pony has reached the age of eight years. Animals
 three through seven years old will be issued an annual Temporary Certificate of Measurement and must be re-measured annually
 until the age of eight years. Animals eight years and older will be issued Standard Certificates of Measurement which will not need
 to be renewed. Measurement must be done on USEF Combined Driving and Dressage Pony Measurement form.
- Individual responsible for presenting the pony for measurement must be 18 years old.
- Animals submitted for measurement or re-measurement must show no evidence of lameness, and must be jogged for soundness prior to the measurement. Animals showing evidence of lameness are not eligible for measurement or re measurement.
- The pony must be entered to compete at the competition for a measurement to take place.
- When the competition veterinarian is on call and an alternative measurement time is necessary, management must receive a written request for measurement from the owner or agent at least five days prior to the start of competition to set up a time.

Classes per Day

Horses are limited to a maximum of three Dressage rides per day at Fourth Level and below (including Rider Tests) or two Dressage rides per day above Fourth Level. Horses competing at both Fourth Level and Prix St. Georges, or their equivalents, are limited to two Dressage rides per day. Dressage Seat Equitation, Quadrille, Pas de Deux, and Materiale classes are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition.

Consecutive Levels

Horses may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition.

Opportunity Classes

Opportunity classes are intended for entry level riders. Horses and riders entered only in "Opportunity" classes are exempt from USEF and USDF membership requirements, and do not have to pay non-member (show pass) or HID fees. Federation and drug fees do not apply. Horses entered only in these classes are still subject to and must comply with the Drugs and Medication rules and are subject to drug testing. Riders and/or horses entered in "opportunity" classes may not cross enter into other recognized classes at the show. Participants must abide by all USEF regulations pertaining to attire, tack and equipment for the recognized show. Reference USEF rule GR821 for additional information.

General Regulations, Policies, and Entry Specifications

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules are in force from the moment show management allows access to the showgrounds. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire.

Liability – Horses by their inherent nature present a risk. This show, the management, the USEF Licensee, and the facility will not be responsible for any loss or damage or injury to horses exhibited, or for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost or destroyed, or in any way injured. Each exhibitor will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person, whomsoever, by any horse owned or exhibited by said exhibitor and shall indemnify the show, the management, the show committee and volunteers, the USEF Licensee, the USEF and USDF, or any member thereof, against all claims and demands, of any nature or kind, that may grow out of any injury occasioned by any horses owned or exhibited by them, or arise from the negligence of the person in charge of any such horse. All horses exhibited in this show participate entirely at the owner's risk. Neither the Organizing Committee, show volunteers and staff, the facility or its owners, USEF or USDF or their members will be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors or spectators. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

Additionally:

- Texas Rose Horse Park (TRHP), and their officials, sponsors and employees will not be responsible for any accident or loss which
 may occur to any exhibitor, spectators, guest, rider, groom, attendant or other employee, animal, or equipment at any of the
 competition.
- WARNING: Under Texas law (Chapter 87, Civil Practice and Remedies Code), a farm animal profession is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in farm animal activities resulting from the inherent risks of farm animal activities.
- Accidents: A participant involved in an accident shall not depart from the area or facility where the equestrian activity took place
 without leaving personal identification, including name, phone number and address, or without notifying the proper authorities, or
 without obtaining assistance when that person knows or reasonable should know that any other person involved in the accident is
 in need of medical or other assistance.

USEF Membership Statement (GR901.9)

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Exhibitors should exercise extreme caution before medicating their horses and should be aware of the US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules governing drugs and medications. Any questions about the use of certain medications and regarding Rule IV should be directed to the USEF Federation Equine Drugs and Medications Program, 956 King Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43212-2655. (800) 633-2472, (614) 299-7707, FAX (614) 299-7706.

Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges, officials, or volunteers, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees.

Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.

No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.

Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions regarding or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the horse show management; their decision will be final.

Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials and refuse any entry for a cause; to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his or her horse for cause; to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his or her ribbons and winnings for cause; to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause; all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition.

Trainer: A **trainer** is defined as any adult, age 18 years or older, who has responsibility for the horse on the competition grounds. A trainer must sign the entry form.

Protective Headgear Rule: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses and those competing in all classes and tests must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must be immediately prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.

Bridle Numbers: Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is being exercised or ridden.

Important notice to all affected parties: Third parties may come upon the property or enter the facilities where any herein described or listed event will occur; provided, that this is a license to enter the premises, for the purpose of observing or participating in the event, but not otherwise, and such license to any individual is subject to revocation by the owner, lessee or organizer, and entry for any purpose other than granted herein, shall be deemed criminal trespass and subject to appropriate legal proceedings.

Attention Competitors: Each competitor is responsible for supplying the show management with the correct and required association numbers of USDF and/or USEF for the horse, owner, rider, coaches, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not count towards national awards. All entries for Open Classes are taken on a first come, first served basis. Only one horse-rider combination per entry form.

Sharps Disposal: Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Containers are located at the end of each barn aisle and within center aisles when center aisles are present within the barns.

Membership/Registration Requirements for GAIG/USDF Qualifying Classes: Riders must be current USDF Participating members and USEF members (Junior, Senior, or Life) in good standing. Horses must be USDF Lifetime Registered and USEF Annual or Lifetime recorded. Horses with only an HID recording are not eligible. Owners must be current USDF Participating or Business members and USEF members (Junior, Senior, or Life) in good standing. For current Great American/USDF Championship requirements, see: www.usdf.org/competitions/competitionschampionships/regionals/index.asp.

Show Schedule and Ride Time Conflicts: It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule. Changes need to be requested in the show office by 3pm the day prior.

Safe Sport: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

Current Rules: The rules may have changed from the current USEF Rule Book. It is the competitor's responsibility to check the current USEF Rule Book for any changes. Current rules can be found on www.usef.org



<u>USDF Membership Benefits:</u> USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions:

Owners and riders, including foreign riders

and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$100), 5-years (\$400), or life (\$2,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$80). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$280) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$55 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$45). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$95. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$140) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.


The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

Asan educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.
